Letter from the President of BHRSC

On Oct 28, 2012 Buddy (BHRSC alum Dusty) was doused in lighter fluid and lit on fire in Camarillo. He died two days later from his injuries. Andrew Delgado, the 18 year old son of Buddy's adoptive family, has pled no contest to felony animal cruelty and felony arson.

BHRSC was devastated by this event and has worked tirelessly to find justice for Buddy. First by spreading the word through media outlets and canvassing the Camarillo neighborhood and later helping to raise a \$25,000 reward for information leading to an arrest. Most recently we have been keeping vigil and attending Delgado's court dates.

Buddy was a BHRSC hound who was pulled from the shelter very close to the time he was scheduled to be euthanized. He was a young, sweet guy who won over everyone he met. BHRSC realized that we owed it to Buddy to live up to the promise we make to each hound in our care, to protect and speak for them as best we can. I'm thankful that in our 15 years of existence, BHRSC has never experienced anything so heinous happening to one of our hounds. There are moments in your life that you will never forget and the details of the minute I realized Buddy was one of our hounds will be forever etched in my mind.

It has been a trying time for BHRSC but over the past few months I have been continuously amazed at the level of dedication of our volunteers and supporters. We worked together pushing for awareness of Buddy's story until it was covered worldwide. We have learned a lot and I hope the knowledge we have gained from this horrific event will be stored away somewhere safe but never applied again.

Delgado will be sentenced on February 13, 2013. The maximum sentence for this crime is 3 years in state prison. It is likely he will receive a lesser sentence of 1 year to 16 months. No amount of jail time will bring Buddy back and it is hard to imagine being satisfied with any number of years, but I am thankful that we were able to pull together to make a statement about the intolerance we feel about animal cruelty.

The year has had its highs to match the lows. Through all the news and work for Buddy, BHRSC volunteers rose to the occasion of caring for all the hounds in our care. Despite high intake numbers, no hounds spent the holidays in boarding and Springs Games was the most successful one yet. We have worked hard to cut administrative costs in order to leave more for medical care and we were able to go above and beyond for a few special hounds this year.

Through it all I have never been more honored and proud to work with such a dedicated group of volunteers and supporters. I look forward to a new year full of success and belly rubs for the hounds.

- Each year 3 to 4 million animals die in shelters while only 27% of dogs are adopted from a rescue or shelter. Don't shop, save a life!

- Rescue dogs make great pets. The majority of dogs in rescues and shelters lose their homes when their families move or experience financial hardship. With the current economy, the number of homeless dogs is increasing. These loving animals will be great additions to your family.

BHRSC Needs Fosters

A lot of people tell me that they don't foster hounds because "I could never give them back." Yes, we all get attached to our foster dog and there is sadness when he or she leaves. But there is also an immense feeling of satisfaction that you have been a major part in saving an animal's life and that it was your love and care that helped to make that hound such a special animal.

"So how do I prevent myself from becoming too attached?" Most foster families never think of a foster hound as "mine." Each dog already belongs to someone else -- it just so happens that they haven't met that person yet. It's like baby-sitting - the kids can be loads of fun, but they're not your kids

Not only does fostering provide a healthier atmosphere for the hound, but it allows us to get to know these dogs, discover their quirks and then better match them to the right human companions.

Fostering makes a difference. Everyone benefits. The foster gets to spend time with a special hound, and BHRSC gains space for another hound in need. The foster hound gets a break from kennel life and a second chance at becoming a cherished pet.

So what is fostering? For me, it's the most rewarding thing I've ever done. And you can do it, too!

Crunchy Doggy Granola Bars!

Ingredients

½ cup coconut oil or butter

³/₄ cup hot chicken or beef broth

½ cup milk (buttermilk or kefir can also be used)

1 egg, beaten

½ teaspoon salt

3 tablespoon (heaping) parsley

3-4 cups whole wheat flour

2 cups quick oats

Directions:

1. In a large mixing bowl, place butter or coconut oil and pour hot broth over to melt it. Stir in milk, egg, salt, & parsley. Once combined, add in oats and begin combining whole wheat flour in, ½ cup at a time. The dough should be hand-moldable, and not stick to fingers when ready to roll out.

- 2. Continue adding flour until dough is stiff. You might find yourself going over the 4-cup mark. This is OK.
- 3. Once the dough is formed, roll it out on your counter and use cookie cutters to form shapes (optional), or spread it in a bar pan. The dough should be rolled edge-to-edge in a 12×15-inch pan. Once the dough is situated in the pan, use a pizza cutter and cut the dough in squares that are size-appropriate for your dog.
- 4. Bake at 325 degrees for 50 minutes, then turn off the oven and leave them in for another 2 to 3 hours and allow them to harden.
- 6. Cool completely and break apart with your fingers the pre-cutting allows you to snap them apart easily, even though they are hard and ready for your pooch.


